A national dance company is needed now. Young dancers and choreographers have to know they have a future in their own country.

I have found it in Dancecyprus. This

courageous company, sponsored by the Ministry of Education, is committed to developing excellence through its programme of performances.

Dancecyprus has the potential, talent and enthusiasm to make a major contribution to lifting the international standing of culture in Cyprus. However, this will not happen without adequate Government, EU and other funding combined with a new look at the need for the promotion of dance and other performing arts through the school curriculum.

Dancecyprus' successful experience with young people from the villages on the Company's Outreach Programme who were invited to watch rehearsals, showed a keen appetite among them for the art. The young are the future of Cyprus and her culture and they deserve a better inheritance than they have at present.
